The most severe liver disease from alcohol consumption is cirrhosis. This occurs when the scarring caused by drinking begins to replace much of the healthy tissue. This is known as fibrosis. Alcoholic cirrhosis is the most serious type of alcohol-related liver disease. Cirrhosis results when the functional cells of the liver die and are replaced with scar tissue. Sources suggest that between 10%-20% of chronic heavy drinkers may develop alcoholic cirrhosis. The condition often takes years to develop.
