Art as Experience, Dewey's greatest work in aesthetics, had its antecedents. There were scattered short essays and remarks on aesthetics and art in the 1880s (Dewey 1896, 1897) as well as significant discussion in his Psychology (Dewey 1887). Some discussion appears in Democracy and Education (Dewey 1915) and in his other works on education.
