No Regulated Standard for Natural Wine Though natural wine is among the strictest and most self-imposed versions of winemaking, there's no legal classification or regulated standard to define the actual process.

In fact, "natural wine" is most often made from grapes that were also grown either organically or biodynamically. But while some wines made from organic or biodynamic grapes may be processed as mainstream wines are, the "natural wine"-making process is generally intervention-free.

Natural wine is at the end of the sustainable, organic and biodynamic wine ethical continuum. The grapes must be organic or biodynamically sourced, nothing but indigenous yeast can be used, and nothing can be added to the fermenting/vinification process. For instance, natural wines have no added sulfites.

Organic winemaking is essentially wines made from organic grapes with less additives and lower sulfites than allowed in conventional wine. Biodynamic winemaking is essentially wines made from biodynamic grapes with almost no additives and lower sulfites than allowed in organic wine. Natural wine is wine made from organic grapes with no additives and very low or no sulfites.
