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Cpt Repair Posterior Tibial Tendon

CPT 27691 (transfer or transplant of single tendon [with muscle redirection or rerouting]; deep) is the proper code for transferring the flexor digitorum longus tendon to replace the damaged posterior tibial tendon. CPT 27658 (repair, flexor tendon, leg; primary, without graft, each tendon) would be used to repair the posterior tibial tendon (the synovectomy would be included).

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Posterior tibialis tendon surgery is a way to fix the tendon on the back of your calf that goes down the inside part of your ankle. A surgeon can do a few different types of surgery to fix this tendon. The posterior tibialis tendon is a strong cord of tissue. It is one of the most important tendons in your leg.

Tendon repair: Procedure, recovery, and complications

The correct CPT is 28555, as anchors are typically placed to imbricate the ligament and T-N capsule. I am not certain that this is typically performed with various posterior tibial tendon/FDL transfers, so if the repair was performed as above, I believe you should code and bill as noted.

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During your surgery, your doctor will make an incision in your ankle and the damaged posterior tibialis tendon will be repaired. It may be removed entirely, and another tendon from your foot may be grafted in place. After the procedure, the incision will be closed, and your foot will be bandaged.

Physical Therapy After Posterior Tibial Tendon Surgery

If there is no potential for nerve recovery and bracing is unfeasible or poorly tolerated, then a posterior tibial tendon (PTT) transfer or Bridle's tendon transfer may be considered. The ideal candidate, to ensure a successful clinical outcome, has a mobile nonarthritic ankle with maintained passive range of motion, minimal deformity, and at least 4/5 PTT strength.
