Starting in the sixteenth-century, Flemish and Dutch artists turned to everyday subjects, describing the landscape and people around them with humor and loving detail. This exhibition from the DIA collection will include more than seventy works on paper, highlighting prints by Pieter Bruegel I, Hendrick Goltzius, and Rembrandt van Rijn, as well as drawings by Bartolomeus Breenbergh and Esias van de Velde.

The sixty-six works represent all our holdings by the seventeenth-century Dutch and Flemish masters. This is an especially prominent and cohesive group, representing the art of draftsmanship in the Netherlands. It includes more than ten drawings by Rembrandt, half a dozen each by Jordaens, Jan van Goyen, and Willem van de Velde.

The Dutch lived in the north in Holland (now the Kingdom of the Netherlands). The southern part became Flanders (now Belgium and part of northern France), where the Flemish people lived. Before the division Dutch and Flemish painting had been very similar. After the division their styles remained much the same, but their favorite subjects changed.

Venus and Cupid is from a series of drawings Van Mieris made after sculptures by Franciscus van Bossuit (1635-1692), a Flemish ivory carver who lived in Amsterdam during the last eight years of his life. Of the 13 drawings in the series, 12 faithfully reproduce casts after Van Bossuit's sculptures. Venus and Cupid is the exception.
