Patient manual handling should only continue in cases which do not involve lifting most or all of a patient's weight. This rules out for example, the shoulder or Australian lift. The Health and

Ensure regular housekeeping is undertaken to reduce clutter and remove obstructions (trip/slip hazards) from walkways. Ensure storage is organized so heavier or frequently used items are located between chest and mid-thigh. Ensure floor surfaces are level, clean, non slip and anti-fatigue mats as required.

An estimated one-third of all reported accidents in healthcare settings result from moving and handling, and approximately 40% of all sickness absences in the health service are attributed to moving and handling accidents (Department of Health, 2002).

Sprains and strains were the main types of manual handling injury. Of injuries to registered nurses, 40 per cent involved the back, 12 per cent the upper limbs, and 9 per cent the lower limbs. Of injuries to enrolled nurses, 30 per cent were to the back and 17 per cent to the upper limbs.
