### Access 2010 - Macro Converted to VBA, Where Is It Stored?

When a database starts, Access runs the AutoExec macro before it runs any other macros or VBA code. Create an AutoExec macro. If you have already created a macro that contains the actions that you want to occur when the database starts, just rename the macro to AutoExec, and it will run the next time that you open the database. Otherwise, follow these steps to create a macro: On the Create tab, in the Other group, click Macro.

### Create a macro that runs when you open a database - Access

Enable Macros Microsoft Access 2010. Step 1 - Click on File and select "Access Options". Step 2 - On the left side of the window, select "Trust Center". Step 3 - With the Access Options window open, Select "Trust Center Settings" button. Step 4 - In the Trust Center window, click on Macro Settings on the left side.

### Access Developer - Enable Macros In Microsoft Access 2010

On the Create tab, in the Macros & Code group, click Macro. Access opens the Macro Builder. On the Quick Access Toolbar, click Save. In the Save As dialog box, type a name for the macro, and then click OK. Continue with the section Add actions to a macro.

### Create a user interface (UI) macro - Access

Open the Macro. Go to the Design Tab, you will find button "Convert Macros to visual Basic".

If you name a macro Autoexec, Microsoft Access automatically runs it when your database opens. You can also open Microsoft Access from a command line and specify a macro name after the /x switch to run it when it opens. For instance, you can run the macro named MyMacro like this:
