This completely misleading statistic was banned by the Advertising Standards Authority.

Misleading statistics in advertising In 2007, Colgate was ordered by the Advertising Standards Authority (ASA) of the U.K. to abandon their claim: “More than 80% of Dentists recommend Colgate.” The slogan in question was positioned on an advertising billboard in the U.K., and was deemed to be in breach of U.K. advertising rules.
