Manual Focus Controls used Use this option when you wish to adjust focus manually or when using a manual focus lens. To focus manually, select manual focus mode and adjust the lens focusing ring until the image displayed on the clear matte field in the viewfinder is in focus. Photographs can be taken at any time, even when the image is not in focus.

Nikon D40 Owner's Manual

In manual exposure mode, you control both shutter speed and aperture. Shutter speed can be set to values between 30s and 1/4,000s, or the shutter can be held open for indefinitely for longer exposures (bu _b). Aperture can be set to values between the minimum and maximum values for the lens.

The manual mode also cancels the preflashes for photographing people with REAR flash sync or to eliminate blinking. The D40 lacks wireless control and Flash Exposure lock of more expensive Nikons. If you want to uses these features, get a D80 or D200. I explain these at D80 Built-in Flash Modes.

Changing lens aperture in Manual mode is a little tricky. First, make sure that the dial on the top of the camera is set to "M" position. Next, press and hold the +/- button located right below the camera shutter, then rotate the rear command dial to change aperture.

To use focus lock, you need to set your camera to single shot autofocus mode (AF-S). Then, frame the scene so your subject is in the centre and half-press the shutter release until the camera focuses.

The D40 does not have a built-in autofocus motor, which means that only Nikon lenses compatible with focus motors or designated with AF-I, AF-S can be used in autofocus mode. The Nikon D40 was tested by various independent reviewers, generally receiving very favorable comments for its ergonomics and image quality.
