### **Surface bidirectional reflectance and albedo properties ...**

The fraction of the total light striking a surface that gets reflected from that surface. An object that has a high albedo (near 1) is very bright; an object that has a low albedo (near 0) is dark. The Earth's

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albedo is about 0.37.

1. Introduction. Land surface albedo is a key geophysical parameter controlling the energy budget in land-atmosphere interactions (Dickinson, 1983). Land surface albedo varies spatially and evolves seasonally based on solar illumination changes, vegetation growth, and human activities such as

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cutting/planting forests and slash-and-burn agricultural practices.

The VIIRS surface albedo is retrieved with a direct estimation method, which directly links surface broadband albedo with VIIRS TOA reflectance through statistical modeling. The training data used to establish the regression models are obtained through simulation of physical models.

The albedo of a land surface is the non-dimensional ratio of the radiation flux reflected by a (typically horizontal) surface in all directions and the incoming irradiance, which is the radiation flux from the upper hemisphere. This is technically known as the bihemispherical reflectance factor, and both fluxes must be relative to the same spectral range.

Albedo is usually differentiated into two general types: normal albedo and Bond albedo. The former, also called normal reflectance, is a measure of a surface's relative brightness when illuminated and observed vertically. The normal albedo of snow, for example, is nearly 1.0, whereas that of charcoal is about 0.04.

## **Earthshine and the Earth's albedo: 2. Observations and ...**

Albedo is an app designed to measure the albedo (or reflectance) of a surface. Albedo is simply defined as the ratio of light reflected from a surface to the light incident upon the surface. The albedo of a surface can be easily interpreted as the percent of incident light reflected by the surface (e.g. Albedo of fresh snow ~ 90%; Albedo of asphalt ~ 10%).

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The albedo is the combination of the atmosphere and surface reflectance and increases with SZA over land also, but to a lesser degree relatively. A high albedo surface reflects 80% of incoming radiation. The low albedo surface reflects only 10% of incoming radiation. The amount of energy that is reflected by a surface is determined by the reflectivity of that surface, called the albedo. A high albedo means the surface reflects the majority of the radiation that hits it and absorbs the rest.
