The Structured Assessment of Violence Risk in Youth (SAVRY) is similar in its approach to violence risk assessment; however, it is for juveniles. The HCR-20 includes the following historical risk factors with guidelines on how to identify and code these risk factors.

Risk assessment in this Guide refers to the practice of using a structured tool that combines information about youth to classify them as being low, moderate or high risk for reoffending or continued delinquent activity, as well as identifying factors that might reduce that risk on an individual basis.

Risk Assessment in Juvenile Justice: A Guidebook for ...

Broadly defined, a risk factor for juvenile offending is any experience, circumstance, or personal characteristic that increases the probability that a given youth will commit a legal transgression. No single risk factor causes offending; many youths who have been exposed to various risk factors never commit a crime.

Juvenile Offenders Risk Factors (Forensic Psychology ...

This study examined the validity, reliability, equity, and cost of nine juvenile justice risk assessment instruments. Though many researchers and practitioners believe that risk assessment is critical to improving decision making in the juvenile justice system, the range of options currently available makes the selection of the most appropriate instrument for each jurisdiction a difficult choice.

A Comparison of Risk Assessment Instruments in Juvenile ...

The Risk Factor Profile Instrument (RFPI) is an assessment tool based on a literature review of the risk factors associated with early onset of chronic and violent youth delinquency. The RFPI's main objective is to identify children who have committed a criminal offence and are at high-risk for escalating into more serious offending and continuing on a path to chronic violent delinquency.

Tools to Identify and Assess the Risk of Offending Among Youth

Common contexts in which violence risk assessment occurs include involuntary civil commitment, release from prison or forensic hospital, sentencing, transfer of youths to adult court, and sexually violent predator determinations.

Juvenile justice service staff began exploring the use of actuarial risk assessments that classify offenders by the likelihood of future delinquency with earnest in the 1970s, but actuarial risk assessments have been used by public social service agencies in the United States since 1928.

A Comparison of Risk Assessment Instruments

The Structure Assessment of Violence Risk in Youth (SAVRY) is an example of an assessment designed to estimate the risk of youth committing a specific offending behavior (in this instance, violent acts). Youth Level of Service/Case Management Inventory. The YLS/CMI is a 42-item risk/needs assessment measure developed specifically for youth.

Risk/Needs Assessments for Youths Literature Review

Common risk factors for general recidivism among adolescents include antisocial personality, previous criminal involvement, negative self-image, economic disadvantage, parental rejection, negative parent-child relationships, interpersonal aggression, and poor social relationships.

Many risk factors for youth violence are linked to experiencing toxic stress, or stress that is prolonged and repeated. Toxic stress can negatively change the brain development of children and youth.

The Predictive Validity of Risk Assessment with Violent ...

The SAVRY (Borum, Bartel, & Forth, 2006) is modeled after existing structured professional judgment instruments like the HCR-20, but it is designed specifically for assessing violence risk in adolescents (ages 12 – 18). The authors of the SAVRY have included items for rating both risk factors and protective factors.
