Sefer Yetzira, (Hebrew: "Book of Creation"), oldest known Hebrew text on white magic and cosmology; it contends that the cosmos derived from the 22 letters of the Hebrew alphabet and from the 10 divine numbers (sefirot). Taken together, they were said to comprise the "32 paths of secret wisdom" by which God created the universe.
