Finally we get to "Seymour: an Introduction" in 1959. Also narrated by Buddy Glass, "Seymour" is a sort of free form, plot-free discussion of Buddy's brother, Seymour. Buddy, at age 40, attempts to portray an accurate picture of his dead brother, but quickly admits that to do so is impossible.
