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The Postal Acceptance Rule In

The posting rule (or mailbox rule in the United States, also known as the "postal rule" or "deposited acceptance rule") is an exception to the general rule of contract law in common law countries that acceptance of an offer takes place when communicated. Under the posting rule, that acceptance takes effect when a letter is posted (that is, dropped in a post box or handed to a postal worker).

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usages of mankind, the post might be used as a means of communicating the acceptance of an offer, the acceptance is complete as it is posted.”

The postal rule is exclusion to the general rule, which dictates that acceptance is effectual on receipt. The rationale behind the postal rule is that it encourages contracting by parties at a distance by making the person in the position of giving an acceptance just as protected as if the contract was being completed face to face.

The legal rule that when an offer in contract is expected to be accepted by post, the time and place at which the acceptance is posted is the time and place at which the contract will be taken to have been formed. The rule will not apply where the offeror does not intend the contract to become binding until they receive the acceptance. In Australia, the postal acceptance rule has been interpreted more narrowly than in other common law jurisdictions.

The postal rule is an exception to the general rule that contract acceptance must be communicated directly to the offeror and acceptance is only effective when the offeror receives that acceptance. The acceptance is actually effective as soon as the offeree mails the acceptance, according to Cornell University Law School.

What Is the Postal Rule in Contract Law?

Postal Rule Definition: A rule of contract law that makes an exception to the general rule that an acceptance is only created when communicated directly to the offeror. An acceptance is binding and the contract is said to be perfected when the acceptor places this acceptance in the mail box for return mail even if, in fact, it never reaches the offeror.

The controversial Anglo-American postal acceptance rule has been under much discussion since the subject's first well-known appearance in *Adams v. Lindsell*¹ in 1818. It is a rule which, although necessary in some form, can, and does, vary from country to country.

This case is the first step towards establishing the postal acceptance rule (mailbox rule). It was not until 1892 in *Henthorn v Fraser* 2 Ch 27 that the court determined the precise timing of the acceptance, that is the moment the letter of acceptance is posted.
